

Future-BME 2026 Student Case Study Competition Rules

Presentation Requirements

- Each team is required to prepare a presentation.
- The presentation may include backup slides that can be used to provide additional explanations and support answers during the Q&A session with the jury.
- Each team will have **10 minutes** for the presentation and **7 minutes** for the Q&A session.
- Teams will be notified **one minute before the end** of the allocated presentation time.
- If a team exceeds the allotted presentation time, the jury will allow the presentation to continue until completion. However, exceeding the time limit may negatively affect the team's final score.

Evaluation Criteria

The jury will evaluate teams based on the following criteria:

1. Attractiveness of the Idea
2. Presentation Delivery
3. Presentation Structure
4. Responses to Jury Questions
5. Feasibility of the Proposed Solution

Criterion	Description	Weight
Attractiveness of the Idea	The idea is innovative and feasible. Particular emphasis is placed on practical implementation while incorporating elements of innovation.	15%
Presentation Delivery	Clarity of presentation, body language (eye contact, posture), articulation, confidence, and overall presentation dynamics.	15%
Presentation Structure	The presentation follows a logical and well-organized flow. It includes the following sections: Analysis, Strategy, Implementation, and Expected Outcomes . The solution is presented within the allocated 10-minute time limit.	30%
Knowledge and Responses to Jury Questions	Team members demonstrate a strong understanding of the problem and provide clear, relevant, and well-argued answers to jury questions.	20%

Feasibility of the Proposed Solution	Practical applicability of the proposed solution and its potential demand and relevance in the market.	20%
